



District 25 - G Eyeglass Recycling Program

Most Lions Clubs in our district are already participating in the collection and recycling of used eyeglasses. This is a great service project to help repurpose eyeglasses for use in the districts' eyeglass missions to Mexico each year. Currently we collecte approximately 25,000 glasses and "process" them through a facility located in Dunlap.

Several times a year "Wash-A-Thons" are held where 30-35 Lions will come together on a Saturday morning, wash and inspect glasses that are collected by the district clubs. Typically, we will see representatives from 5-8 clubs at one of these sessions. Glasses are then "read", to determine their individual prescriptions, labeled and further sorted into one of nearly 70 categories, including, men's. women's, children's, near sighted, far sighted, single vision, bifocals, and simply reading glasses.

We accept all glasses for this program, even badly scratched, damaged or broken glasses. Those glasses that cannot be processed for our mission, still have value to the program. We use a scrapping facility that buys those glasses for the metal content. The only things we request you do NOT send are cases and lenses without frames.

This process is a twelve-month program and the success depends on the cooperation of all clubs. If you need additional information or would like to schedule a program for one of your club meetings, contact PDG Marty Juel at marty@martyjuel.com.

News from Roann Covered Bridge Lions Club

The Roann Covered Bridge Lions have been a busy club. They sponsored "Clean up the Town" on June 16th. They were able to fill 3 large roll-off dumpsters with trash and filled 5 trucks with scrap metal, tires, old paint, etc. They helped clean up the road leading to the Covered Bridge by weed eating the roadside ditches.

The Lions recently gave a check to a sick child from the community that is in the hospital for an extended stay.

The Roann Covered Bridge Lions sponsored their annual 4th of July celebration. Since the 4th was on Wednesday this year, the events were held on Saturday, June 30th. Tractor pulls started at 10:00 am and went through the evening. These were followed by Fireworks!!

The Club plans to have the Caboose in place and on display by time for the Covered Bridge Festival the weekend of September 6 - 9, 2018.

Exciting New Grant Projects Announced by LCIF

More than 50 new grant projects were approved at the May Board of Trustees meeting, including projects in every constitutional area. Diabetes, Lions' new signature cause, was the focus of several grants, including one to establish camps and support groups for adolsecents in Romainia. In Wisconsin, a grant was approved to purchase equipment for a cancer unit at a children's hospital. A grant awarded to Lions in Japan will help expand a school in Bangladesh. In addition, LCIF and Special Olympics International agreed to renew their partnership until 2023, which means expanding upon the global activities that serve Special Olympics athletes and promote inclusion. These are just a few examples of the life-changing projects Lions are organizing around the world with support from LCIF.

Speaking of making the world a better place, LCIF now has even more ways to empower the service of Lions. We're launching two new grant opportunities, Leo Grants and District and Club Community Impact Grants, which you can read more about on LCIF.org. We're also expanding our global causes to include diabetes, childhood cancer, the environment and hunger in addition to sight, youth, disaster relief and hunamitarian service. All of this will be made possible by our most ambitious capital fundraising campaign yet. I encourage you to watch for more information soon on how you can be a part of this effort and empower the service of Lions.

The Indiana Cyber Lions Club (ICL) is a new statewide Lions Club, supporting general community service projects of interest and those of Lions Clubs International. Lions Clubs are an association of non-religious and non-political service clubs, currently serving over 200 countries around the world.

The club conducts its business online, organizes service projects around the state, and also keeps members aware of other Lions service projects happening in their area. ICL is your gateway to the work of over 400 Hoosier clubs and our 10,000 members!

The club holds no formal meetings, except for one general meeting, held annually at the State Lions Convention to comply with the Lions constitution. You serve where you can, when you can. This allows you to keep your busy schedule and still be a part of the largest service organization on the planet. Your time is valuable, so our objective is MORE SERVICE AND NO BORING MEETINGS.

ICL will determine its own service focus as it matures and grows. The five Indiana State Projects, as well as the Indiana Lions Foundation and Lions Clubs International Foundation are common to all Indiana Lions Clubs. These and other projects such as eyeglass recycling, vision screening, hearing programs and others yet to identified will be considered by the new ICL.

ICL and its members may also opt to support events and projects of clubs in its area. We encourage traditional Lions Clubs to contact ICL with their events and local service projects, so that we may work together.

Working online greatly simplifies and speeds service efforts, while also making it easier to be a Lion.

The Indiana Cyber Lions Club is an Ideal way for prospects to become a Lion when they cannot commit to regular meetings and activities. As this group grows, a master calendar of service projects is envisioned to elp CyberLions become involved in their area, or as they may travel as part of their work status. The ICL is in the process of being chartered and additional charter members may be added for a limited time only. This opportunity is currently only available to new members and no transfrer members can be accepted.

BREAKING NEWS!

Indiana Lions Foundation supports The Cloverdale Lions Club and the ISBVI Trustees with a \$750 grant towards purchase of a SmartBoard!

In late 2017, Cloverdale Scout Troop 93 raised \$3,314 through a Dining-in-the-Dark fundraiser, which offered attendees the opportunity to experience a visual impairment while eating dinner. The Cloverdale Lions Club has historically supported the troop's local Eagle Scout projects. This partnership led to the Troop's decision to donate the net event proceeds to the Cloverdale Lions to be used to purchase a SmartBoard for the school.

SmartBoards, interactive white boards used for classroom instruction, are especially beneficial for visually impaired students, providing extra magnification and highlighting, among other features. The Smart Board's high resolution provides this and is an excellent workspace for these students to work independently. Some ISBVI students have additional disabilities and may not be able to stand while completing tasks....a SmartBoard helps them stay engaged.

Since the amount raised did not fully cover the entire cost (purchase and installation) of a SmartBoard, application was made to the Indiana Lions Foundation for a \$750 match. On being advised of the initial donation and the matching grant, Jim Durst, ISBVI School Superintendent said "We are grateful for strong community partners like Troop 93, the Cloverdale Lions Club and the Lions of Indiana. With their continued support, we are able to improve our educational tools and truly make a difference for our low vision students."
